

To All Elliott Clients who are not currently affiliated with the ECC,

As a courtesy we are attaching a written communication from our attorneys in the Dominican Republic regarding certain letters that have been sent to their office. These letters were written in response to a request from "Elliott Support". This written communication will also be posted on our website: [www.eclientscom.com](http://www.eclientscom.com)

The ECC deplores the illegal and inflammatory tactics that are being used by Elliott Support. After you read this letter we would suggest that you take the time to read the actual court documents and depositions regarding this case which are posted on our website, especially the "NEW" depositions of Fred and Derek Elliottt. We are confident that if you study the facts you will understand why the ECC is determined to follow the legal course we are currently pursuing to protect the investments of all clients who have joined our group.

All:

We have received numerous emails and letters that you were apparently instructed to send to our offices by Messrs. Elliotts and their counsel in the above referenced matter. These actions constitute a violation of the ethical obligations of the legal profession, especially since none of you are party to any proceedings in the courts of the Dominican Republic, and none of you are represented by our law firm.

It is important that you be aware that such a massive intrusion of our firm's privacy and conduct of business bears serious consequences under Dominican law, which we hereby invoke.

This serves as your formal notice that we have submitted a complaint to the Dominican Telecommunications Agency, Indotel, for violations of both the Dominican Telecommunications Law No. 153-98, and the Cybercrime Act No. 53-07. This action has

been directed against all of you personally, as well as all of those who directed you to engage in such illegal practices, and the specialized department in the National Police has already been asked to certify the IP addresses from which such emails were sent.

The penalties under the Dominican law for such infractions entitle us to claim both civil damages as well as administrative penalties that will amount to several tens of thousands of dollars per infraction. Unfortunately, you have been ill advised and misled on this matter, particularly as to the fact that none of you are party to any proceedings in the Dominican Republic and none of your letters will have any effect on the actions and proceedings currently before the Dominican courts.

The injunction and temporary restraining order issued against the Elliott defendants by the Dominican court is in full force and effect, and its issuance was not based on any of the information the counsel who induced you to take these actions has mistakenly conveyed to you. Let us also make it absolutely clear that it does not involve any misrepresentation whatsoever from our part or our clients. We are aware that our judgments differ from those issued in the US and Turks and Caicos Islands, as to the length and structure, but the reasons outlined by the Judge in its Order are far distinct from those you incorrectly point out in the letter that has been drafted for you to sign and send.

Please refrain in the future from contacting us directly, since we are not your legal counsel in this case. Also, it would be advisable to pass along this message to those who intend to follow in your steps, so that they can avoid prosecution and further legal costs.
